2011 EVENTS:

February 4: Chinese New Year Celebration – Enjoy Front Street as Maui's Chinese New Year is celebrated with the performance of Lion Dancing.

February 11: LAC Annual Meeting – If you are already a member of LAC or are thinking about becoming a member then stop by the Pioneer Inn at 5:30 pm on February 11 for pupus and meet our current Board Members.

March 12-13: Whale & Ocean Arts Festival - Lahaina celebrates the annual migration of Pacific Humpback whales with the Whale & Ocean Arts Festival. On Saturday and Sunday from 9am to 5pm in Banyan Tree Park, artists display their best marine-themed art for sale with musicians playing both days. Enjoy a kids ocean art contest, whale photo displays, a marine touch pool exhibit by Maui Ocean Center as well as marine life educational displays and presentations.

April 23-24: Banyan Tree Birthday Party - Honoring the 138th birthday (planted April 24, 1873) of Lahaina Town's famous landmark, the Banyan Tree. This festival includes a birthday cake, keiki activities, nature artworks displays and live entertainment.

June 11: Na Kamehameha Pa`u Parade & Ho`olaule`a - A colorful floral parade through Lahaina Towns Front Street at 10 am features Pa`u riders on horses decorated with exotic island flowers representing each major island. The community parade includes marching bands, floats and more, all honoring King Kamehameha the Great's families.

July 4 – 4th of July Fireworks - Stroll historic Lahaina and enjoy holiday specials in many ocean view restaurants and town shops. For an old-fashioned Independence Day celebration, listen to a variety of bands play in a free concert on the oceanfront Lahaina Library lawn starting at 5 pm. A fireworks display lighting the night sky over Lahaina's roadstead is scheduled for 8 pm, presented by Maui Chamber of Commerce. Fireworks can be viewed from charter boats in Lahaina Harbor and on land throughout LahainaTown.

October 31: Halloween Celebration – The LAC is in the initial stages of getting the fun back to Lahaina for this years Halloween. Keep posted for further developments.

December 4-5: Banyan Tree Lighting and Snow Festival - Lahaina's historic Banyan Tree is lit up with thousands of Christmas lights for the entire holiday season. Santa Claus makes an appearance and community choirs sing Christmas carols. See the World Culture Exchange Hula performances on stage. Kids are invited to play in real snow at the "snow zone" and families can take photos with a Hawaiian snowman. Enjoy a holiday arts and crafts fair along with Hawaiian musical entertainment. Tenants of the Old Lahaina Courthouse host children's holiday art activities and cookie decorating workshops.
